Dear Parishioners

As I am writing this we are all acutely aware of the war which is taking place in Ukraine and the people there who are so severely affected. For most of us, this will be the first time in our lifetimes or memory, Europe finds itself at war. We will all be worried, not so much for our own safety but for all those caught up in it. We have been taken by surprise I think to a large extent the world has been taken by surprise.

It will seem to many of you that as we start to emerge from the pandemic we have new challenges to meet. The cost of living is certainly increasing but compared to those caught up in the devastation of war we hardly dare complain. Recently in Kirkoswald there was an appeal for items for the children of the refugees in Poland. Within the two hour window, when donations were received, the response was overwhelming from local people. Several further volunteers gathered to next day to sort and place the items in a lorry which had to do two trips to deliver the gifts to the collection destination. As in the last two years the community response in the Eden Valley has been very uplifting.

We are approaching the Easter season and are in this period of Lent. For Christians Lent is the period of waiting before the great event of the Christian year: the remembrance of the death and resurrection of Christ that gives all who trust in him forgiveness and eternal life. The importance of Easter cannot be underrated, it is the most detailed account of anything in the Bible. Similarly, with its forty days of anticipation, Lent focuses us on Easter. We have got used to the idea of Advent calendars with their daily open-door path to Christmas. Lent is, if you like, an invisible Easter calendar of forty days leading to the cross and resurrection. (It's worth noting that one is often marked with the daily presence of chocolate and the other – at least for some Christians – marked by chocolate's absence). This lengthy build up is important, particularly this year as we pray for peace and look for those opportunities where we can help in any way those who are suffering from the consequences of war.

Hope you have a peaceful Easter

<u>Gigabit Internet - Broadband for the Rural North</u> (B4RN) An Update for Gamblesby and Unthank

After a number of months of apparent inactivity, residents who signed up for the B4RN Gigabit all fibre broadband will be pleased to know that the new service is close to being provided. For those who didn't sign up, don't worry, you still can get the service. Following B4RN's successful lobbying of the Department of Culture Media and Sport, the scheme has been extended to provide project funding beyond the previous closing date of 30 September 2021. Support will now stay in place until the Melmerby installation project has been completed.

The planning of our project will soon move to the build phase. This means that you will start to see digging equipment appearing between Busk and Melmerby. This will be the installation of ducting from the start of the route (next to the bus shelter in Melmerby) to join up with the ducting that has already been installed throughout KO village and then on through Parkhead and Renwick and which terminates near Busk. The first stage will, unfortunately but necessarily, be a short road closure starting 11th April in the narrows at the southern end of Gamblesby to allow ducting to be buried into the roadway, as there is no verge at this point that can be used. The remaining ducting from Melmerby to Busk will be completed after that – mainly by B4RN contractors using a mole plough to reduce the impact on the ground.

Before B4RN can connect fibre to participating households, the householders must have 7mm ducting in place from their house to the boundary of their property, and visible at the roadside, so that the B4RN contractors know at what point to dig to when they start installing ducting along verges and across Gamblesby village green. Once this is installed, and before B4RN install the actual fibre to each property, the householder needs a House Connection Kit. This consists of an external and an internal junction box, which will need to be installed either by the local team of dedicated B4RN volunteers, or by a B4RN approved contractor.

The volunteer team can install both ducting and boxes for a total cost of only £50. Typically, a contractor would charge $\pounds 50-\pounds 60$ for fitting just the boxes with additional charges of $\pounds 100$ or more for installing the ducting depending on the complexity of the site and the length of ducting required.

Site visits by the B4RN volunteers to discuss routes and options have already started – look out for them, they will be wearing B4RN identity badges, and as they all live in the villages, you will most likely know them.

There is still an opportunity for those who have not signed up for this 1000Mbps <u>full</u> <u>fibre</u> broadband service to do so, though this opportunity will cease once the project has been completed. After that time, the installation costs will increase significantly as the volunteer team will disband and the householder will have to pick up all the costs and organise their own equipment and ducting installation. Furthermore the £150 voucher from the Government, to offset these costs, will cease.

Herald April 1922

Cold and snowy. The Helm blew from 21 March to mid-April. Easter, 9 April.

Parish meetings season (annual public event). Ousby's said The Shire Pond's railing is about to collapse, and our roads are deplorable. The RDC gets £310 a year (now £24,800) from Ousby. Melmerby's said 'our letters arrive too late in the day. See if GPO Carlisle could sort this. Lazonby trying to get the western approach to Eden Bridge fenced and hopes Melmerby will back them.

The RDC wants to know who owns the derelict house on Skirwith Green. Can we remove it? There is measles in Culgaith and Langwathby. Lot of old houses in the RDC's area, but the Govt. has axed the council houses fund for economy. (Britain is broke, after the war)

Whist Drive 7:30pm and Dance 9:30pm at and for the Victoria Institute, at Culgaith Friday 7th (Good Friday evening) 2s-6d including supper (£10 now) Concert for Addingham District Nursing Fund, Fri 31st March, Maughnaby School, made £11; dance included afterwards. The organiser was Mrs John Wood (Little Salkeld)

Vicar in choir. Opened with piece by the Vicar on piano. Mrs Atkinson sang the Floral Dance. A one-act farce concluded.

Langwathby May Day is on 20 May (Advance Notice, 8 April)

Langwathby's bobby is PC Winter. His father, John Winter, 70, lived at Ainstable til Saturday 8^{th.} Coal delivery shed door struck him and broke his skull. He died there next day.

The Vicar of Edenhall and Langwathby, the Rev. Bernard Hale is now old and has been on 6 months leave to rest. He returns on Easter Wednesday.

Gamblesby Congregational Church (run from Penrith's) now fundraising for urgent repair.

Robert Winter, waggoner, Lazonby, was on the wrong side of the Kirkoswald road when Robert Beatham (Glassonby), joiner in Lazonby, cycling to work collided and fell off. Laid up at home. Police Sgt Graves (Lazonby) came and arrested Winter. The Court fined him 5/- (now £20) and costs, 18s/6d (Now £70) for being too far from his horses to control them.

William Teasdale, late of Hunsonby, now Brougham Castle Farm, fined 25/- (now \pounds 100) for using an unlicensed travelling traction engine.

Married at Lazonby Church 26^{th} , John, elder son of Mrs and the late Mr J.H. Jackson, Red House, Skirwith to Euphonia Mary (Effie), only daughter of Mr and Mrs R Holliday, Scaur Bank Lazonby.

Died at Unthank (Gamblesby), 31 March, William Bird, late of Cannerheugh, 86, buried at Addingham, Sun 2 April, 3pm.

At Gatelete, Culgaith, 20th, Sarah, wife of William J Sewell, age not said, buried at Culgaith on 23rd at 3pm.

Died on 16th at his son's (Mr A Metcalf, Glassonby Hall), Mr Joseph Metcalf, retired farmer, well-known along the East Fellside. Farmed in and near Glassonby lifelong. Short service at the house, then main one at Addingham Church. Kin from Kendal and Temple Sowerby there and friends from Newcastle.
