

Melmerby Parish Council held an Ordinary meeting on January 19th 2022, at Melmerby Village Hall. In attendance were Parish Councillors David Bardsley, Ruth Beaumont (Chair), Gary Fletcher, Chris Jones and Marjorie Jones (Vice-Chair), along with the Parish Clerk, Lisa Beken, and four members of the public.

- It was unanimously agreed to object to planning application 21/1052 at 6 Bridge Terrace, Melmerby, for a proposed second floor extension, on the grounds of planning policy, overlooking and appearance. The application was subsequently withdrawn by the applicant.
- It was agreed to proceed with the manufacture of a replacement noticeboard.
- Potential dates were agreed for a public meeting with PC Norman Black, to discuss traffic issues in the village. (This meeting will be held prior to publication, on February 15th and an update will be provided in the April issue.)
- Consideration was given to commemorating the Queen's Jubilee, which will be further discussed at the March meeting of the Parish Council.





From the Herald: March 1922

Fine and mild, but blizzards by 24th. Hunsonby and Winskill now have a District Nurse, Nurse Wilson, funded by local events e.g. this month's Whist Drive and Dance in the Hunsonby Institute.

W.I.'s Langwathby and Edenhall had Miss Hasell (Dacre) on Citizenship; Competition, Antique entries included a 200 year old

umbrella!



Sale of Work (Craft Fair) and Tea in the School – 24 February. The School sang the operetta "John Bull and his Trades" produced by the Head (Miss Crosthwaite) (Report 4 March names the cast.) About 2/3 of sum needed is now in hand.

Hunsonby School's new Head comes next week (6 March), Mr James Shiach, a Carlisle man, presently teaching in a large Sunderland School. He was a prisoner of war for three years.

Mr Percy Howson is leaving Primrose Bank of Skirwith to farm at Wyresdale Hall Home Farm near Lancaster. Skirwith will miss him.

Langwathby residents can get fishing permits for Mr Nelson's water from T. Fisher (apt name). No others may now fish there. (Notice).

Addingham W.I., Nurse Wilson gave a talk on First Aid to about 45 people; Competition a homemade doormat, won by Miss Egglestone, Glassonby. County Council Elections: Eden Hall Division (for Gamblesby, Skirwith, Gt Salkeld too) the sitting member Mr Charles Henry Shaw lately tenant of Eden Hall, now lives at Rampsbeck/Watermillock. He was unseated by Mr Isaac W Simpson, farmer, Skirwith, majority 707.

Langwathby Parish Council discussed whether the Coal Club should be revived (answer No) and noted that Messrs Green have shortened a signpost (no further details).

Died at The Square, Cuxhoe, Joseph husband of Ellen Rowe of Culgaith, 65, buried at Cuxhoe on Saturday 4/2. At Ousby last week suddenly Miss Isabella Atkinson (60) in bed. Heart failure; at Fellside House, Ousby 9/2 Hannah Mary infant daughter of J and J Johnston. Recently the late Mr John Powley's son the Rev. Robert Powley aged 61; he went to Queens College, Oxford, his aunt was the late Miss Mary Powley, who got Langwathby's spelling back from Longwathby!
