Dear Friends,

Back in 2018 I went to the World Museum in Liverpool to see an exhibition of some of the Terracotta Army figures from China. The clay statues in the exhibition were breathtakingly awesome. It was an amazing experience to see them face-to-face.

It all got me thinking about beliefs concerning the afterlife. What happens to us when we die? Perhaps there's nothing at all. The person I am now simply ceases to be. I am no longer here, any more than I was before I was born and became conscious of my own self. This mortal, physical body decays and goes back to inanimate matter. There's certainly some support for that view even in the pages of the Bible. "From the dust you came, and to the dust you return..." (Genesis 3.19 and Ecclesiastes 3.20)

But, maybe the part of me that is me somehow does go on and is not extinguished. The consciousness continues somewhere else. Why is it that so many different cultures across the globe, scattered in time and location, have all independently developed some idea of life beyond life? And, including China over 2,200 years ago when this Terracotta Army was created. The New Testament of the Bible certainly gives us the hope of a life to come for those who trust in Jesus. Life after life.

And, if there is life beyond the grave, what kind of existence will it be like exactly? Will it be anything like this, or is it simply indescribable?

The first Emperor of China, Qin Shi Huang, had a vast mausoleum built, including all these clay model soldiers to protect him in the afterlife. I wonder what kind of afterlife he expected it to be. Would it be just the same as this one with its warring factions, and the strong oppressing the weak? Anyway, what can you take with you across into the next world?

You can't take it with you when you go?

Hmmm... Try telling that to Qin Shi Huang and his Terracotta Army

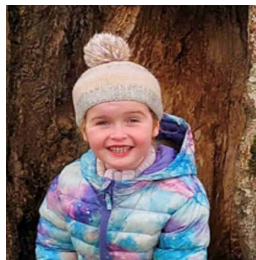
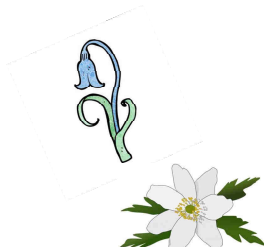


My name is Esma. I am 9 years old. My favourite subjects at school are Art, History & Science. My hobbies are playing football, swimming & playing the harp.



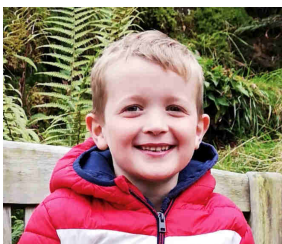
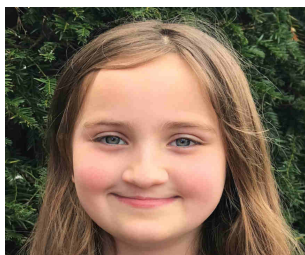

Herald May 1922

Cold, wet, snow on tops 1st to 17th. Deluge 23rd. No cricket yet. Postage is cheaper now, and the budget cut 1s 0d off income tax, to 5s 0d in the pound (= 25% of your income).

The Addingham PCC's annual meeting notes The Rowley Trustees offer of 1/2 acre to extend the churchyard, and accepted it.

Sir R.G.Musgrave Bart. has resigned the Deputy Lieutenancy he holds here as he now lives in London full time.

Two farmers bringing cows in after dusk heard cries of 'Help!' from a tree, and found young Joe Tolmie birds-nesting, had been stuck four hours in it. The wind carried his cries away from home and nobody'd come 'til the farmers, who got him down!

The RDC examined and passed Culgaith new reading room plans. It also voted to clear a blocked footpath in Winskill and sue if need be (no further details).

A large room upstairs in Eden Hall was consecrated by the Bishop to be the forthcoming Girls' School Chapel, to seat 120.

Langwathby May Day, Saturday 20th, on the green procession, 1:30, led by The Penrith Sons of Temperance Band. Crowning 2.30pm, Maypole dancing 3 and 6pm. Tea, 4pm (adults 1s 0d, children 6d each, 6d = £3.60 now). Village sports. Dance & Supper in the marquee 7pm. Bicycles stored for a fee. The vicarage outbuildings are to be done up for letting, or demolished if past it.

Herald May 1922 cont'd

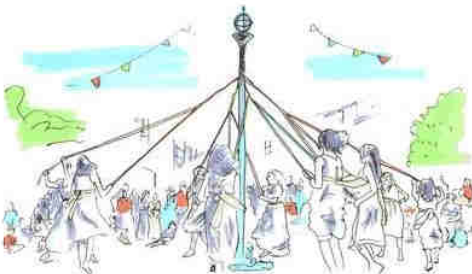
After nearly two years of prodding the GPO, Kirkoswald, Lazonby and Great Salkeld now have a telephone line each (one to the P.O. only). The GPO thinks this will run at a loss hence the delay.

Married in St. Andrew's, Penrith, 30th April, Albert Dew of Chapel en le Frith to Edna E Edgar, Culgaith; at Culgaith Church, 17th, Ambrose L, 2nd son of Mr. A.B. Sinclair (Headmaster of the Penrith Boys' National School) Benson House, Benson Row, Penrith, to Isabel Johnstone, 2nd daughter of the late Samuel Callender and of Mrs. Callender, Pea Top, Culgaith.

Died at Winskill, 3rd May, Isabel, wife of Samuel Lowthian, 72. In the Cumberland Infirmary, Carlisle, 22nd, after an operation, Richard Henry Cannon, Cross Keys Farm, Blencarn, 51; born in Blencarn, he was the youngest son of the late John Cannon. RHC was a farmer and a breeder of the real fell ponies; big funeral. Politically, he was a Liberal, (most farmers then as now were Tories).

Langwathby's rubbish dump is badly sited, says RDC. Also, in droughts, the local milk coolers hog the water.

Langwathby is now the sole place in the Eden Valley to have a May Day.
