#### Dear Friends,

Many words have been written and spoken since the death of Queen Elizabeth II. Many stories have been told recounting people's memories of her. I first heard the following story a number of years ago, and I have no way of ascertaining its veracity. Is it true or apocryphal?

Every Sunday evening at St George's chapel in Windsor there is a service of Evensong which the Queen would attend when in residence there. Once, the young Methodist minister in Windsor was asked (in a spirit of ecumenism) to step in and cover the service, which he did with great nervousness. He had been warned that after the service, the Queen would invite him back to the Royal Apartments for afternoon tea. And so, after the service, she duly led him along some corridors in Windsor Castle to a drawing room, where tea had been set out.

He was expecting some servants or a butler to come and help, but the Queen explained that it was Sunday evening and all the staff had time off. Graciously she invited him to help himself to sandwiches and cake, while she poured the tea from the pot.

They sat down and began to chat, but it was awkward for him to balance the plate of food on his knee. Disaster and embarrassment! The plate slid off and smashed on the floor, much to the delight of the corgis round his ankles. What happened next, though, truly amazed him. As there were no staff on duty to help, the Queen herself got up, went into a kitchen area, opened a cupboard door, and pulled out a dustpan and brush.

She then knelt down and swept up the mess that had been made! What must it have felt like to have the Queen kneeling at your feet?

Is it a true story? I don't know... But the truth to learn is one of humility. Just as Jesus knelt and washed his disciples' feet, so we must humbly follow, and be willing to serve others. "I have set an example for you," says Jesus, "that you will do just what I have done for you." [John 13.15] Are we willing to follow Jesus' (and the Queen's) example of humble service?

MEMO SHORTS Apologies from The MEMO team to Addingham Church for missing an advert in the printed edition of September's MEMO

#### **Herald October 1922**

Fine, cold, windy. Harvest in by 14th. Colours at best by 20th. Frozen tarns by 27th. GMT returns 8th.

Addingham W.I.'s competition was fruit bottling. One lady's entry was bottled in 1911 but still good. Edenhall and Langwathby W.I.'s talk was Leather Work; met in the Long Room, Edenhall.

The County Council tarred the Hartside road from Penrith - Melmerby, mid October.

Park Head's minister, the Rev. R. Batey led the Harvest Service at Gamblesby Congregational Church, Sunday 1st October.

John, youngest son of Mrs Mounsey, (ex Melmerby Mill) was born at Melmerby, went to Manchester to learn the Millinery trade (ladies' hats etc), went to the City of London c.1905, and is now elected to the Common Council of the City, its inner circle. He has been Councillor for Cripplegate Without (ie outside the wall) for 15 years, he could be Lord Mayor soon.

Born, 1872, early October, an heir for Eden Hall. The bells of St.Andrew's, Penrith, rang in celebration. The Musgraves are highly regarded in Penrith and district (the baby became Sir R.G. Musgrave, 12th Baronet, who sold up and died in 1926).

Married, 1922, at Appleby United Methodist Church, 21st October, Frank, son of Mr. & Mrs. Burton, Hunsonby, to Jane, daughter of Mr. and the late Mrs. T.A. Fawcett, Trainlands, Maulds Meaburn.

At Langwathby Church, 21st, by the Rev'd B.G.R. Hale, Harry, youngest son of Mr. & Mrs. Mounsey, Langwathby Hall, to Helena (Nellie), youngest daughter of Mr. & Mrs. Waugh, Langwathby.

Died at the Home Farm, Edenhall, 4th, Lydia, widow of Edward Lancaster, age not said, buried at Kirkland, 12th.

Died at Swinton, Manchester, 12th, Annie Isobel, wife of Joseph Ritson Kidd, 36. She was buried in Addingham Churchyard.

Died at Town Foot, Melmerby, date not said, Sarah, wife of Christopher Morton, 45, buried at Melmerby, Sunday 15th, 21.30pm.


# **Langwathby Village Hall – Renovation Consultation**





# New Electric Vehicle Charging Point at Gamblesby Community Centre

Drivers of electric vehicles now have the opportunity to recharge them if they are near Gamblesby. The community centre has a new charge point, with a twin socket to enable two cars to charge up at the same time, Electric vehicle which was installed this year by 'Charge My Street', a community benefit society installing and operating



charge points initially in Lancashire and Cumbria but now expanding nationwide. The lack of charge points where people need them (especially in rural areas) is one of the biggest barriers to the full scale changeover to electric vehicles, which is vital to the reduction of air pollution and the control of greenhouse gases. The one at Gamblesby is in a particularly strategic position, offering a chance to recharge before making the long ascent up Hartside to Alston and beyond.

The charge point can be found in the car park at Gamblesby Community Centre close to the building. It is automatically lit at night. It operates on the maximum possible charge available at the time, and the actual rate of charge depends on the car. A Nissan Leaf would get enough power to drive 70 miles on a 3 hour charge, and a Renault Zoe enough to drive 70 miles on a 1 hour charge. Payment for the electricity used is made via an app called the 'Fuuse' app on your mobile phone. The cost is 48p per kWh. The charge points use the Community Centre's power supply and the cost is reimbursed by 'Charge My Street'. The Community Centre acts just as a host for the charge points and makes no profit nor incurs any losses from the transactions.

'Charge My Street' is committed to improving the overall network of charge points, in both rural and urban areas wherever residents cannot install their own domestic charging points because they have no driveways, given that it is illegal to run loose power cables across pavements and roads.

Trustees of Gamblesby Community Centre are also considering installing solar panels on the south facing aspect of the roof and incorporate battery storage, which would offer the opportunity for allowing electric vehicles to be charged using the highest possible proportion of generated green energy.
