

#### A Christmas Carol by Charles Dickens (1843)

Such a bustle ensued that you might have thought a goose the rarest of all birds--a feathered phenomenon, to which a black swan was a matter of course--and in truth it was something very like it in that house. Mrs. Cratchit made the gravy (ready beforehand in a little saucepan) hissing hot;

Master Peter mashed the potatoes with incredible vigour; Miss Belinda sweetened up the apple-sauce; Martha dusted the hot plates; Bob took Tiny Tim beside him in a tiny corner at the table; the two young Cratchits set chairs for everybody, not forgetting themselves, and, mounting guard upon their posts, crammed spoons into their mouths, lest they should shriek for goose before their turn came to be helped. At last the dishes were set on. and grace was said. It was succeeded by a breathless pause, as Mrs. Cratchit, looking slowly all along the carving knife, prepared to plunge it into the breast; but when she did, and when the long expected gush of stuffing issued forth, one murmur of delight arose all round the board, and even Tiny Tim, excited by the two young Cratchits, beat on the table with the handle of his knife, and feebly cried, "Hurrah!"

There never was such a goose. Bob said he didn't believe there ever was such a goose cooked. Its tenderness and flavour, size and cheapness, were the themes of universal admiration. Eked out by apple-sauce and mashed potatoes, it was a sufficient dinner for the whole family; indeed, as Mrs. Cratchit said with great delight (surveying one small atom of a bone upon the dish), they hadn't ate it all at last! Yet every one had had enough, and the youngest Cratchits in particular were steeped in sage and onion to the eyebrows! But now, the plates being changed by Miss Belinda, Mrs. Cratchit left the room alone--too nervous to bear witnesses--to take the pudding up, and bring it in.

Suppose it should not be done enough? Suppose it should break in turning out? Suppose somebody should have got over the wall of the backyard and stolen it, while they were merry with the goose--a supposition at which the two young Cratchits became livid! All sorts of horrors were supposed.

Hallo! A great deal of steam! The pudding was out of the copper. A smell like a washing-day! That was the cloth. A smell like an

eating house and a pastry-cook's next door to each other, with a laundress's next door to that! That was the pudding! In half a minute Mrs. Cratchit entered--flushed, but smiling proudly--with the pudding, like a speckled cannon-ball, so hard and firm, blazing in half of half-a-quartern of ignited brandy, and bedight with Christmas holly stuck into the top.

Oh, a wonderful pudding! Bob Cratchit said, and calmly, too, that he regarded it as the greatest success achieved by Mrs. Cratchit since their marriage. Mrs. Cratchit said that, now the weight was off her mind, she would confess she had her doubts about the quantity of flour. Everybody had something to say about it, but nobody thought or said it was at all a small pudding for a large family. It would have been flat heresy to do so. Any Cratchit would have blushed to hint at such a thing.

Like most longstanding cultural customs, the precise origin of telling ghost stories at the end of the year is unknown, largely because it began as an oral tradition without written records. But the season around winter solstice, has always been one of transition and change. For a very long time, the season has provoked oral stories about spooky things in many different countries and cultures all over the world.

Spooky storytelling gave people something to do during the long, dark evenings before electricity. The long midwinter nights meant folk had to stop working early, and they spent their leisure hours huddled close to the fire. Plus, you didn't need to be literate to retell the local ghost story.

It was in Victorian England that telling supernatural tales at the end of the year—specifically, during the Christmas season—went from an oral tradition to a timely trend. This was in part due to the development of the steam-powered printing press during the Industrial Revolution that made the written word more widely available.


This gave Victorians the opportunity to commercialise existing oral ghost stories. Higher literacy rates, cheaper printing costs, and more periodicals meant that editors needed to fill pages. Thanks

to all of this, we have two of the greatest stories ever written in English: A Christmas Carol and Mary Shelley's Frankenstein (1818).



#### **Melmerby Parish Council**

#### Wednesday 19th October 2022

4 Parish Councillors present and 9 members of the public.

The following key points were discussed:

- Welcome to the 2 new parish councillors Bill Burford and Dougie Bell following the results of the recent election.
- The Parish Council fully supports the speed limit review to extend the 30mph limit and introduce 40 mph buffer zones on the A686 on either side of the village.
- Highways issues including a pothole at the edge of the village green, missing area of resurfacing near Gamblesby road junction and re-siting of the AONB brown sign.
- Approval to go ahead with a parish information board offered by the AONB.
- Update on the parish projects including the refurbishment of the coronation bench, new noticeboard and new goalposts for the village green.

**GAMBLESBY CHAPEL REMEMBERS.....** The ladies who attend the regular Tuesday Morning 'He Brews' coffee club at Gamblesby Methodist Church, have been busy knitting poppies which now produce a stunning display along the church railings. Inspired by the dreadful conflict in Ukraine, as well as knitting the traditional red poppies, a number of yellow poppies have been included. Purple and white poppies also remember the animals lost in World War One and the hope for peace. The community came together for a Remembrance Service led by the Rev'd Chris Blackshaw. The Little Acorns Creative Christian Children's Club made a war memorial and poppy wreaths especially for this service.

#### .....AND GAMBLESBY CHAPEL LAUNCHES WARM SPOT



The Coffee Club have also been successful in securing a grant from the Cumbria Community Foundation in order to extend its hours to provide a warm safe meeting place as part of the Governments 'Warm Spots' initiative. The club already provide a meeting place for local people who come together to knit, play dominoes and/or just have a good chat. This funding will allow

the club to extend its opening hours every Tuesday from 10am to 1pm. With a warm drink and light refreshments available, it is hoped that even more local people will take advantage of this facility and save money by not having to heat their homes for a few hours.

#### From The Herald—December 1922

Fine and mild weather from mid-November to mid-December followed by cold, wet and windy weather.

At Penrith Police Court, Joseph Falder of Winskill was fined £1 (c£80 now) for travelling with spiked wheels on his traction engine and thresher. Melmerby's bobby (police officer) had followed the marks back to the farm and arrested him. His defence—that he knew they were not permitted but could not travel without them—was rejected on the basis that they wrecked the new, tarred roads.

Culgaith's School's Bazaar & Dance raised £20 (c£1600 now) for its new swimming bath.
