Dear Parishioners

Easter is the climax of the Christian year and cannot be underrated, it is the most detailed account of anything in the Bible. Lent, with its forty days of anticipation, focuses us on Easter the time of remembrance of the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ who gives all who trust in him forgiveness and eternal life. We have got used to the idea of Advent calendars with their daily open-door path to Christmas. Lent is, if you like, an invisible Easter calendar of forty days leading to the cross and resurrection. (It's worth noting that one is often marked with the daily presence of chocolate and the other – at least for some Christians – marked by chocolates' absence).

The week before Easter Sunday, known as Holy Week, starts with Palm Sunday where we commemorate Jesus riding into Jerusalem on a donkey. Kirkoswald actually has a donkey which accompanies us as we walk from the chapel to the church singing hymns and carrying palm crosses. Happy Birthday, Mid-Eden Magazine: "MEMO"

t is with great pleasure - and some relief! - that we can celebrate the 50th birthday of our Mid-Eden Magazine. Yes - that's over 550 editions of our Parish Magazine that have been dropped through the letterboxes of households in

Addingham, Culgaith, Edenhall, Gamblesby, Kirkland, Langwathby and Skirwith. Actually, it's more than 550 editions because in the beginning -April 1973 - there were 12 issues a year rather than 11.

But the magazine's origins go earlier still, with its roots in Culgaith where a monthly village newsletter had been produced by the local church with two aims: "as a means of obeying Christ's words to go out into the world and preach the Gospel'; and "to foster a true feeling of community and fellowship by giving items of local interest and a diary of events for the future weeks."

We cannot truthfully say there have been 550 editions of "MEMO", however, for the magazine had no name until September 1976. Until then, the cover design simply included the names of local villages. Then, a competition was launched to name it with the condition that it must be "short and with geographical connections". This drew 32 suggestions, one of which came from Jeremy Godwin of Penrith: "MEMO", short for "MID EDEN MAGAZINE". Yes - that's the same Jeremy Godwin who has faithfully contributed to MEMO since January 1976 with Notes from the Archives. (Before then there were articles "From Other Days" penned by William Dodd of Ousby.)

At that early stage, MEMO was typed onto stencils which were attached to a rotating, inked drum. There was no clipart, of course, and the only illustration was on the cover. Printing was done by Mr JC Monkhouse.

The first edition had a contribution "From the Vicarage" by David R King, and various church notices; there was the forthcoming visit from the Library van; a Culgaith WI outing to Harrogate Spring Flower Show (details from Mrs Collin or Miss Ball); a Langwathby/Edenhall WI visit to Edinburgh arranged by Mrs Beattie and a demonstration on Puff Pastry at Bells of Lazonby. Contributions for the second edition were to be given to the Vicar or Miss Burkett.

MEMO has evolved in its technology, content and style as well as now being delivered to 13 villages rather than just the original seven. But has it remained true to its original mission statement? This is how Alan Stephenson described its raison d'être in that very first magazine that led to MEMO and all its volunteers serving our community for 50 years without a break:

"Whatever our work or other interests, we belong to this bit of countryside, share in the life of a small community and contribute to it in some way. Community feeling, a sense of belonging, is essential to the total well-being of men and women...Let us use this magazine as a vehicle for our shared hopes and dreams. Contribute to it and find in it a link which draws us, with all our diversity, into a Comm-UNITY."



# From The Herald: April 1923

Cold easterlies all month (Helm for a week, too).

Good attendance at the Easter's Evening Concert in Ousby.

- Mrs Anne Egglestone, from Blencarn, capable and hard working, married a railwayman in Great Strickland and helped him farm there and also in Gamblesby and Scales. At Scales he was Kirkoswald's Tuesday carrier to Penrith. Retired 1921 and went to live with son William, in Cliburn. Died there on Good Friday at age of 72 years. They had five sons and two daughters.
- At 9pm Wednesday 11th, Robert Davidson, a farmer, Blencarn, was cycling along the Skirwith road when he collided with another cyclist! Alas, it was Constable Wills (Melmerby's bobby) and Robert's bike had no lights! Fined £1 plus costs (now £80 plus costs).
- Edenhall Post Office had a public telephone fitted on the 14th.Calls cost 3d (now £1.80).
- The subject for Edenhall and Langwathby W.I. was Garden Pests and Diseases and the talk was given by a Mr. A Britten from Beck Mill.
- The Gamblesby Parish Council decided that 'Beggars Trod' is an ancient footpath from Unthank to Busk but there was a discussion regarding who owned the footbridge and also who removed the stepping-stones. (the path continues on along the edge of Renwick to Kirkoswald and on towards Croglin).
- Married at Penrith Registry Office on the 14th, C.R., second son of Mr. and Mrs. Hodgson, Bank Hall, to Elsie, eldest daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Clark, Eamont Bridge.
- Died at Hunsonby, 12th, Sarah Alice, 60 years, wife of John Horn. Burial at Addingham, 2pm on Saturday 14th.
- Died at Hog House Hill, Newbiggin (Dacre), 17th, Ann, 52 years, wife of Joseph Preston and daughter of the late Charlotte Hetherington of Spire House. Buried at Addingham.

British Summer Time is from 22nd April to 16th September, 1923.
