John's Gospel tells of Jesus encountering a Samaritan woman at a well and breaking convention by asking her for a drink of water. There followed a slightly confusing conversation as the woman thought Jesus was talking about a physical thirst, whereas he was actually referring to the spiritual thirst people have for meaning, purpose, fulfilment, love, contentment and peace in their lives.

Jesus said to her, 'Everyone who drinks of this water will be thirsty again, but those who drink of the water that I will give them will never be thirsty. The water that I will give will become in them a spring of water gushing up to eternal life.' (John 4:13-14)

I wonder what you're thirsting for at the moment?



What became of Addingham Village?

By the look of the cross now south of the present church, the original church and village was in being by the 10th century. Addingham, the placename, means 'the farm village of Adda's people', and shows that its settlers were Anglians (not Anglicans who first arose in the 16th century) speaking Old English. Some of the earliest settlers came in the 5th—7th centuries from Angels, just south of Denmark. Men with names ending with an 'a' (e.g. Horsa, Offa etc).

The village had another name as well, possibly a local nickname, 'Leigham', which is Old English for 'Farm village in a grassy glade in the wood'. The wood is still there. Some say Leigham means 'Lowlying village' but it doesn't!

The present church dates from 1512 and after. Tradition says that there was a deluge and landslip and/or earthquake that flooded the original village. This will have occurred circa 1500. Possibly the landslip or blockage e.g. by fallen trees, was just downstream at the mouth of the Daleraven where it joins the Eden and if in full spate, the waters backed up onto Leigham. The Eden then changed its course and has run above Leigham ever since. Leigham originally stood 60 feet above the Eden but its bank was washed away during the spate.

In 1794 the foundations of Leigham's houses were visible along the Eden's bank. These will have been at the top of the village. In 1829, bones, crosses, etc. had often been found there. In 1913 the Rev. C.J.Gordon took advantage of the drought and rescued the hogbacks (10th century tombstones) now in the present church's porch. The Eden was only 7' to 10' deep at this time so he got a number of local men to help. Using a rowing boat and grappling irons they managed to raise the hogbacks but it took 5 days. In a wide pool 50 yards north and south of the church they also saw a good many stones from the drowned houses. The ancient 10th century Cross was on the riverside.

West of the church, across the field (and now across the Eden), is St Michael's Well. It's still there but now in Lazonby parish.

If the Eden falls to 10 feet deep again you'll be able to look at the remains of Leigham for yourselves, if they're still visible. In 1794, people said these were Addingham village's houses. Folk-memory last for centuries; a valuable historical source.
