Other vanished villages in the MEMO's area

MAUGHANBY is now swallowed by the farmyard of Maughanby Farm. It was two lines of houses with a green between them. Its buildings, including the original Maughanby School, are now part of the farm buildings. This often happened to small villages. Another such is the one next to Bolton Church. In the same way, farmhouses were demoted to outbuildings when farmhouses grew larger and their owners more affluent.

Maughanby's first settler was a Welshman, Merchiaun, and his family, over a thousand years ago. Next came some Norse farmers, in boats coming up the Eden and moving inland. They added their word for a farm - village. "-by", to "Merchiaun's", its name hitherto.

A farm - village, ("-by" for Norsemen, "-ton" for Angles), began as the farmhouse yard and the cottages of the workforce close by. Each plough needed 6 small oxen to pull it, and each ox had a different owner among the farm's workforce, so they had to live close to the farmhouse. Maughanby's first written record is in 1254 as "Merchaunby" which shows how names get altered over the years.

In 1634 the Vicar founded Maughanby Free School for boys able to be spared from work in the parish. He was the Rev. Edward Mayplett. When the new school was built in 1868, and soon put under the Charity Commissioner's Rules, £25.00 (now worth £2,500 or so) was set aside for the Mayplett Exhibition for pupils going on to higher education. The new school was also closed a while ago now and moved to be more central to reach.

Maughanby is on your right as you walk the path from Addingham Church to Long Meg. The school was on the south side of the farm buildings.

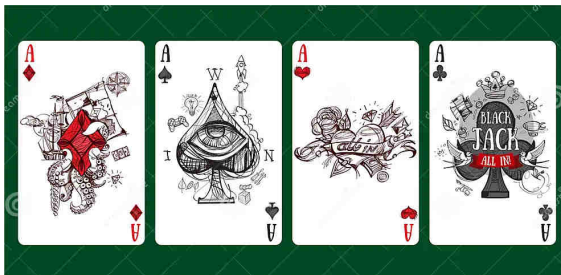

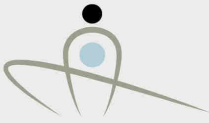

Other vanished villages in the MEMO's area

MAUGHANBY is now swallowed by the farmyard of Maughanby Farm. It was two lines of houses with a green between them. Its buildings, including the original Maughanby School, are now part of the farm buildings. This often happened to small villages. Another such is the one next to Bolton Church. In the same way, farmhouses were demoted to outbuildings when farmhouses grew larger and their owners more affluent.

Maughanby's first settler was a Welshman, Merchiaun, and his family, over a thousand years ago. Next came some Norse farmers, in boats coming up the Eden and moving inland. They added their word for a farm - village. "-by", to "Merchiaun's", its name hitherto.

A farm - village, ("-by" for Norsemen, "-ton" for Angles), began as the farmhouse yard and the cottages of the workforce close by. Each plough needed 6 small oxen to pull it, and each ox had a different owner among the farm's workforce, so they had to live close to the farmhouse. Maughanby's first written record is in 1254 as "Merchaunby" which shows how names get altered over the years.

In 1634 the Vicar founded Maughanby Free School for boys able to be spared from work in the parish. He was the Rev. Edward Mayplett. When the new school was built in 1868, and soon put under the Charity Commissioner's Rules, £25.00 (now worth £2,500 or so) was set aside for the Mayplett Exhibition for pupils going on to higher education. The new school was also closed a while ago now and moved to be more central to reach.

Maughanby is on your right as you walk the path from Addingham Church to Long Meg. The school was on the south side of the farm buildings.
