This year, by coincidence, Ash Wednesday falls on St Valentine's Day. There are many legends associated with Valentine, including a story that he secretly conducted Christian marriage ceremonies. This allowed the new husbands to escape conscription from the Roman army, much to the emperor's displeasure, thus having him martyred. So, on February 14th, I hope that you will take the opportunity to tell somebody how much you love them. And... hear God telling you again just how much he loves you!

Skirwith to Junction with A686 – Road Closure

Culgaith Parish Council is pleased to report that, after working with Highways for a number of years, funding has now become available to undertake 'machine lay surfacing' along the Langwathby to Skirwith road, which will obviously improve the running surface but also reshape and put the camber back onto the road.

The works will take place at the two problem locations, the one by the Beck Mill entrance and also from the 30mph sign in Skirwith back towards Langwathby.

The drainage issues on the low-lying section of the carriageway by the Beck Mill entrance road will be dealt with, with a new drainage system being installed if required, as part of that scheme.

The works will take place under road closure (Junction with A686 to Skirwith - full width works) and are programmed to commence on the 11th March 2024 until the 5th April 2024.

The closure is now on 'One Network' - access for pedestrians and dismounted cyclists through the works is maintained. Vehicle traffic is diverted via A66 and then through Culgaith.

Farms will need to liaise with the contractor for field and property access though long delays may be unavoidable due to excavation extents and material laying and cooling times.

To comply with Health and Safety legislation, there is insufficient working road width for any other traffic management other than a complete road closure.

This work is long overdue in taking place and the Parish Council and WAFC Highways would ask residents and businesses to be patient and tolerant. It is a case of 'short term pain for long term gain'!

MELMERBY

elmerby's first written record is in 1201 as "Malmerbi", then lacksquare "Melmerbi" in 1240, and means "Melmor's farm-village", the "bi" or "by" showing him to be a Norseman. Melmor was an old Irish name which the Norse settlers there had taken into use. (It means "servant of Mary".) Its scenery had not improved since Camden's visit in the early 17th century or so. He called it "a lean, hungry and desolate country". By 1794, the land near the village was farmed. with drystone walls but few trees except around the Hall. Beyond, it looked "waste and deplorable, whilst the eminences frown in the wildest features of sterility": ie the fells were high, wild and bare. In Henry III's time, Wigton's lord owned Melmerby for a while. In the 1380s, the Threlkelds became lords of Melmerby, and then the Pattersons. In 1794, Melmerby had 229 people, all adherents of the Church of England, but one of them was "an excommunicated harlot." (No further details.) The village had 46 houses and the Hall. Its Green was large. Its open common field had 300 acres, but some of it had been hived off for single owners so it had once been bigger. Seventeen of the farmers owned this land. The soil was dry and sandy, good for oats, barley and potatoes but not for turnips or wheat. The Helm Wind flattened any rye. Their 2500 sheep (plus those from Gamblesby and Ousby up on the fell) were carefully bred. The cattle were few and ordinary. There was no school or workhouse. The copper and lead mines have closed.

Additional material from Wikipedia:

The <u>Grade II Listed</u> Melmerby Hall, began as a defensive structure in the early 14th century. A <u>petition</u> received by <u>Edward II</u> between 1320 and 1326 reads:

"John le Denum petitions the King that whereas he has a castle in <u>Cumberland</u> called Melmerby Tower, which could be kept by a dozen men at arms, he has kept it until now and has often been assailed by the Scots to their great loss, and John's lands are so devastated there and elsewhere that he can no longer bear the expense. He craves help in the form of wages or otherwise until times change, because all the country around would suffer great peril and loss if it were taken through lack of garrison."




