It's April and Easter has been and gone. Shop shelves have been cleared of chocolate eggs to make way for more summery products, but if you look in the bakery section, you might well find they're still selling Hot-Cross Buns. In fact, some shops seem to sell them all year round. This got me thinking...

The cross marked on the top of the buns can, of course, be a reminder of the wooden cross on which Jesus was executed. Although crucifixion is a terrible way to die, Christians recognise the cross as a sign of God's great love for the world – even though he'd never done anything wrong, Jesus was willing to suffer and die in order to bridge the chasm that separates humans from God and to enable us to become part of God's family. That's why the day on which Jesus died is called Good Friday, rather than 'unspeakably awful Friday'!

But it's not just the cross that gives these baked treats potential meaning. Hot cross buns are made with bread dough, which reminds me of when Jesus gave bread to his disciples shortly before he died, and told them to eat it in remembrance of him.

Perhaps, being 'fruit of the vine', the raisins in the buns could be linked to the wine drunk at that 'Last Supper' and which we drink during Communion services in remembrance of and in thanksgiving for Jesus' sacrifice for us.

The dough is gently spiced with cinnamon, allspice and nutmeg, recalling the spices used to anoint Jesus' body before He was laid in the tomb.

Some hot-cross buns contain mixed peel, which is bitter, whilst the glaze – and often the dough itself – is sweet. So as we eat the buns, we can think about how the cross was so very bitter for Christ, but such a 'sweet', good outcome for us.

So the next time you eat a hot-cross bun perhaps it will be a reminder of how much God loves you.

Kirkland

Kirkland Parish covers Kirkland itself, Blencarn, Skirwith, Culgaith. At one time more people lived in it than did in the mid 18th century, for the parish church (at Kirkland itself) was much larger than they needed by then, and in 1768 it was taken down and rebuilt smaller. Rebuildings along the Fellside lasted about 100 years (folks were hard-up), and it was rebuilt in 1880 for £500 (about £50,000 today), keeping what remained of the old. Even the 1880 church shows blocked arches. The earliest bits date from c.1300, the time when the first known priest came in 1294. The churchyard cross outside is where the original missionary stood and preached before a church was built.

One priest was no sooner inducted than he got leave to travel for seven years (1370 - 1377).

Kirkland means 'land with a church on it'. Its first mention is c.1140, in the records of gifts to Wetheral Priory, who had it till the 1330's. Later, most of it was given to Carlisle Priory. The Manor of Bank was separate. In 1687 the house there had good panelling in all the best rooms. This manor included Bullman Hills with its lead, silver and copper vein, being mined in the 1820's, with its own smelt mill nearby.

A sheep emerged from a 14-weeks snowdrift at foot of Cross Fell (Kirkland) circa 1800, and lived. In the 1770's - 1820's there were 14 farms in Kirkland; these had shrunk to 4 or 5 by 1847, i.e. merged.

In the 1970's, it was said that the track from Garrigill was a corpse road to Kirkland centuries ago. One funeral party visited all 7 alehouses in Kirkland, then found their horse had gone home, corpse and all.
