Dear Friends.

We spent Easter in Singapore with our son and his family. Being near the equator the sun rises and sets at the same time each day and the temperature was around 30 degrees day after day for three weeks. It was wonderful to spend time together and marvel at the ease in which we can travel round the world, whether by air or on-line using Zoom or Facetime. But it was nice to return to Cumbria where the clocks have gone forward, the days are lengthening, and we have weather.

On Good Friday we attended the early service at the local Methodist Church. Singapore is basically one large city of 5 million people so there were around 200 people. What a contrast to the Eden Valley where we have 15 or so churches and chapels in our Mission Community.

Congregations are more modest on regular Sundays, but when we come together for special services, we realise just how many people are worshipping Sunday by Sunday. There are three special days in the church's year in May: Ascension Day, Whit Sunday (or Pentecost, fifty days after Easter when we celebrate the gift of the Holy Spirit), and Trinity Sunday. And throughout the vear our churches are often full for christenings, weddings, and funerals.

Our village churches may not have underground car parks and restaurants, unlike the one in Singapore, but they sit at the heart of our communities witnessing to God's presence among us. For generations local people have worked tirelessly to ensure that our churches and chapels are open to welcome us for our weekly services and for special occasions. If you feel you can help in any way please have a word with your local leaders or one of the clergy team.

Ousby's Rectors

These begin in 1245, the first on record being the Rev. Roger Peytenin, an unusual one, as he was born illegitimate. He resigned in 1304.

The next two were here 8 years and 4 years. Then came the first graduate (BD); most of the Rectors pre 1672 were not, but had to be able to read and write.

Rector from 1583-1611 was Hugh Rayson. Was he from Rayson Hall nearby?

The Rector in the Civil War and Commonwealth was a L. Milburne, Rector from 1644-1672. Presumably he was a Puritan who jumped ship at the right moment (1660) and kept his job.

Next came Thomas Robinson B.A., Rector 1672-1719. He was a character, but by the 1770's he was all but forgotten. He had a wife, 8 children and many well-connected friends, but stayed put in Ousby, being a keen geologist, natural historian and miner. He was cheerful and lively, Every Sunday afternoon, after Evening Pravers, he took everyone to the pub, where each paid a penny (max.) and sent the youths out to play football, as a non- Puritan activity. Ousby respected and was fond of him. They laughed at his wife though, calling her 'a simple matterless body' i.e. no scholar and no organizer. Mr Robinson did not work as a miner underground; he looked at the geology revealed underground. He was colliery manager at Bolton near Caldbeck c. 1705 and sank £150 of his own money into it. Its owner was the Duke of Somerset who ignored him when it failed. Robinson reopened the Newlands copper mines (near Keswick), but made no money there either. In 1708 he did a moonlight flit to London leaving his wife and children in Ousby. He took with him his as yet unpublished book of research, hoping the Bishop (Nicholson, Lord Spiritual for Parliament) would help but it was all in vain. In desperation, Robinson applied to be Naval chaplain (rock bottom for a clergyman), vouched for by Nicholson. He was posted to HMS Panther, 50 guns, joining her at Portsmouth for a year. He got on well with the officers and crew. He came home to Ousby 1711, but could not pay off his debts even though he owned guite a bit! He died in 1719.

Robinson was followed by George Fleming, M.A., of Rydal (later known as the Rt. Rev. Sir George Fleming, Bart., Squire, of Rydal and Coniston). He was Rector until 1735 when he resigned on promotion. He will have employed a curate to see to Ousby. You could hold several livings that way then and live off their incomes, less the pittances you paid your curates (whom you chose, not the bishop). Curates are not names in this list.




