LITTLE SALKELD

Little Salkeld is the older of the two Salkelds. It was first recorded as Old Salkeld in 1164. Great Salkeld first appears as such in 1242 when it was held by the King of Scots and was "King's Salkeld". In the late 12th century, Little Salkeld was "Sause Salk" as its lord was the Queens'cook, who prepared the sauces. The name means "Willow Wood".

Little Salkeld is part of Addingham parish, but has long had the Vicarage in it. In the late 17th century the Rev. William Sill built it from scratch; he was Vicar here from 1668 to 1673.

Previous lords of Little Salkeld begin with Gospatric (12th century). Then came the Salkelds, till the 1650s, when the last one had to sell up to the scheming Col. Cholmley, who bought the Vicarage for his wife and daughter though he was eyeing Edenhall. However, he died of gout soon after. It then passed through several owners till Lt. Col. Samuel Lacy bought it around 1790 and re-fronted it in fashionable Georgian style, and had Lacy's Caves made. His father was a seacaptain from near Tynemouth. In 1836 the Colonel sold it and moved west of Eden, building Eden Lacy there; he died eleven years later. His grandson vanished in Australia. Long Meg and Her Daughters were on his land.

In the 1790s Little Salkeld had good soil but was stuck in old ways. In 1821 it had 24 families, one per house, totalling 111 people. Its pub was The Druid's Head. (Long Meg was thought to be Druids' work, then.) The mill was built around 1750. The bridge to Great Salkeld was there in 14th century and after, but fell in floods in the 19th century. In 1901 there was also the Long Meg "Alabaster Mine" (for plaster of Paris) and Thompson's Paper Mill near the station. There was a grocer and seven farmers.
