

Some Account of Ousby

This is the title of a pamphlet I was going to write but never did in the 1980's.

Ousby's first known spelling dates from 1195, when it was a going concern called Ulvesbi: "Ulf's farm village". Ulf was a Norseman (peaceable!) who first settled here and got it cleared for farming, removing the woods etc. "Ulf" may have described him very appropriately, as it means "Wolf", a forceful character who knew what he wanted.

By 1292 a broad clearing had been made at Bradley (which means "flat"), and by 1387 there were more animal pens in the yard, giving it its name, Crewgarth (its meaning). Baron Side (first mentioned in the 1230's) has nothing to do with the nobility, but is from a word meaning "Summer Grazing" with a burial mound on it. Townhead began as Thornhead (1278), ie "Headland of Thorns" ("Thornheved"). Rayson Hall was called that by 1704, after Mr Rayson who lived there.

Ousby's first known Rector (1245) was Roger Peytenin, who was in those days a person of "illegitimate birth". He was rector for 49 years, then resigned in 1304. There are two best known rectors. One was Rev Thomas Robinson B.A. (b.1671 d 1719). [See MidEden Memo from May 2024 for more details about him,] The other was his successor, the Rt Rev Sir George Fleming, who became Bishop of Carlisle, and owner of Coniston, Rydal and the fell above Kirkland. He became Bishop in 1735, and resigned Ousby then.

<u>KIRKLAND</u>

Kirkland's name means what it says, "Land belonging to the church on it," though by 1140 its parish was bigger as it also had Blencarn, Culgaith and Skirwith. The church was for all of them and was much larger than today's. In 1768 it needed a total rebuild and was made smaller. In 1880 it was rebuilt again and is the one we see today.

Originally, Kirkland had fourteen farms but by 1770 there were only seven so some must have merged. The Living* was worth $\pounds40$ in 1296 (the year they began) but by 1315 it was only $\pounds8$, a vast drop. (About $\pounds600$ in today's terms.) The list of priests begins in 1294 and its register starts in 1690.

An old tradition tells of a funeral party coming from Garrigill to Kirkland who, before they met the vicar, called at the village's seven alehouses. The pony got tired of waiting and went home again, taking the corpse with it! This is a good story but Garrigill had its own churchyard (it claimed to be older than Alston) and—unless the deceased was a Kirkland man—it's likely that he was from Cashwell leadmines on the parish boundary.** The Parish Register is silent on this! Also, did Kirkland ever have seven pubs at once?

The Bishop of Carlisle used to choose Kirkland's next rector but in the time of Henry VI this right was given to Carlisle Priory, and the Dean and Chapter (its successors) then received it.

In 1794 farms were mostly in grass, much helped by liming. The soil was deep and fertile. Fuel was local coal or peat. There were 4000 sheep on the fell. Cattle were considered "not remarkable except for endurance". In the 1781 blizzard they stood the 24 days on their feet and some of the sheep survived 50 days buried in snow. Blind when they emerged, they soon recovered and sold well. They were "of the short Scots breed."

*A benefice or living is a reward received in exchange for services rendered and as a retainer for future services Its use was adopted by the Western Church as a benefit bestowed by the crown or church officials.

****Cashwell** is a dispersed mining landscape in the Black Gut and Cash Well spring area on the north-east side of Cross Fell.
