


A little ahead of Mid Summer's Day But an opportunity to celebrate

<u>Ousby</u>

William Hutchinson published his History of Cumberland in 1794 – 1797. His speciality was local history and archaeology. His day job was a Solicitor in Barnard Castle, (his family was a Teesdale one.)

He got his friend John Housman to sum up each parish's national resources. John may have been the gardener's son at Corby Castle. His line was Agriculture.

On Ousby, Housman says that Ousby has two sorts of soil. On NW, light and sandy, good for turnips, potatoes, barley, oats



and hay. On SE, a strong cold clay, good for oats and barley. Much of Ousby is grassland. The farms were all subject to the customs of the Manor of Ousby. Its Lord was the Crackenthorpe family of Newbiggin (Temple Sowerby).


Ousby's farmers had about 2000 sheep of the Short Scots breed and home breed, up on Ousby Fell. Near the fells it was mostly treeless, with stone walls round the fields. Tithes were paid in kind i.e. 1/10 of their produce went to the Rector as part of his pay. Cold stormy weather often afflicted Ousby.

The lead mines at Bulman Hills began recently and look promising. Ousby's main fuel was peat from its fells, also a little coal brought from Tindale Fell in Gilsland. Many grouse, partridges and hares lived in the parish, and also many foxes.

Two roads passed through to Appleby and Penrith. (The Appleby road began at Brampton to North West). Ousby had one small school. It had no endowment to help with its costs. Its Rector 1672-1719 was the Rev. Thomas Robinson, beloved by his parish. After church he led them to the pub and then got the football going. <u>His wife was a clueless woman locally known as a simple matterless body.</u>



Pilgrims

One of my memories of secondary school in Yorkshire was the daily assembly when the whole school met in the hall to sing a hymn, listen to a reading and say the Lord's prayer. I still have my tattered copy of 'Songs of Praise'. Our repertoire of hymns was limited, I guess to recognise that our singing ability was also limited (certainly true in my case). We liked lively hymns and one of my favourites was:

"He who would valiant be, 'gainst all disaster.....His first avowed intent, to be a pilgrim".

These words came back to me as we watched the funeral of Pope Francis in May and saw hundreds of thousands of pilgrims in Rome. Pilgrim means 'traveller', often travelling to a religious shrine. The Pilgrim Fathers travelled from England in 1620 to the USA to seek a new life. Closer to home there are many pilgrim routes you can still walk today: the Pilgrims Way runs from Winchester to Canterbury and St Cuthbert's Way runs along the Scottish border.

All our churches and chapels in the Mission Community are places of pilgrimage. You only need to read the visitor's books in most churches to see that people come from all over the world to the Eden Valley, often because of family connections. Some pilgrims just stumble upon our churches and are grateful that they are open. Generations of folk from our villages have loved and cared for our places of worship and our churchyards. Let us be 'valiant' – meaning bold and courageous - despite the disasters in the world today.
