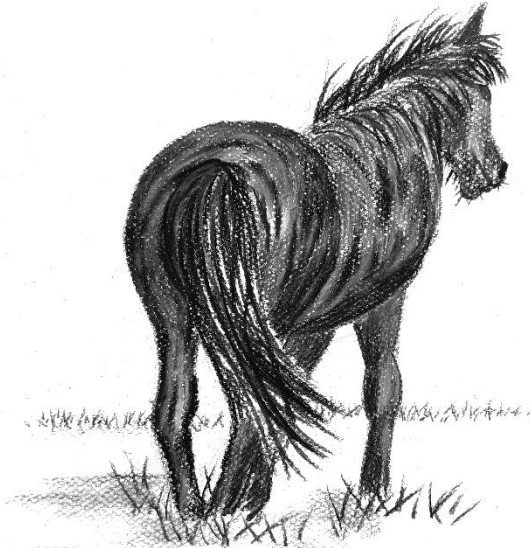

The Old Road from Penrith to Alston as at 1770

As shown on Thomas Donald's first map of Cumberland, 1770, (published 1774). This road, 19 ¼ miles long, had been already turnpiked, i.e. put into decent condition by a committee of local affluent gentlemen who financed its upkeep by charging its users a toll every three miles or so. A toll house and toll bar (a gate across the road) marked the place for these. In it lived the toll keeper (paid by the turnpike's trustees, i.e. the management committee), and his family. Often the toll houses had windows on all four sides, to see if any toll dodgers were creeping round the back. It was his duty to catch them. Persons without cash on them were not allowed through.

Road surfaces varied but were often gravel rolled in. Their widths varied but were about 20-35 feet. Traffic was mostly on two legs or four, with private carriages now and then, and local carts. The new stagecoach from and to Penrith and Hexham, called 'The Balloon' ran along it from Penrith on Monday, Wednesday and Friday afternoon, and to Penrith in the afternoons next days. It used the Hartside road (as now) from Alston to Hartside Cross (summit), then took the new road via Melmerby This was far off in the future (1820s) in 1770 though.

In 1770 it left Penrith via Fell Lane, skirted the southeast edge of the Beacon (wild and open and free till the 1820s). Thence the old road via Cowrick & Edenhall to Langwathby bridge and into Langwathby where it turned left and ran to Little Salkeld, then turned right and ran past the turn to the Gamblesby road (today's). In Gamblesby it turned left and ran to Hazel Rigg and so up the hill and on to Towtop Hill and so to Hartside Cross and Alston. From Hazel Rigg to Hartside it is now a track, but broad for a track.

The Ordnance Survey first (1976) calls it 'Towtop Hill', but no tops as such are visible. The 'Tow' is the old Norse word 'taufr' – 'nasty goings on' – very apt for one end of the Fiend's Fell ridge which has Cross Fell in it. The Fiends were the old name for the Helm wind.
